# Tips for Becoming a Professional Official Marilyn Thompson, Officials Program Director

Congratulations to the 28 junior players who are now

getting paid to be professional officials on the dates they do not play. For players interested in doing this next year I just wanted to give some information. You have to be 16 to apply to join our Professional official's program. If you think this is something you want to do NEXT season, start preparing THIS season! You need to be the referee on the stand as much as possible when your team is assigned to work. You need to recognize and make ball handling calls, back row attacks and blocks, and completely take charge of the match. You also need to practice being second referee and know all the requirements for and that you are benefiting in many that position.

In the early fall the Carolina Region website will have the information available for you to see what steps you need to take to be able to work. Candidates will have to take the professional officials' online clinic and then attend an in-person clinic. Once you have fulfilled these requirements you will spend a complete day being trained and rated without pay. If you do not pass then you will have the opportunity to try again.

The main reason I am giving this information is so you can work this season and ask the adult referee to help you do it correctly so you can pass your rating the first time.

Starting in March the fourth season of club sand volleyball in North Carolina area High Schools kicks off. At the time of this article, projections suggest close to 60 participating schools this year (up from 46 last year) with the addition of a 6<sup>th</sup> conference, which will be made up of several newly participating schools in the Wilmington area. [see group shot below from last year] Last year saw around 500 girls and over 60 boys involved. Follow the action from around mid-March until mid-May at the NC High School Sand Volleyball Club Facebook page. If you're at a school without a sand club, visit the association's website and get ready to add one when school starts in the fall.

The Carolina Region/USA Volleyball is starting its 6<sup>th</sup> year of organizing an NC-based tour of junior beach volleyball events from early April to early August with hosts from Hickory to Wilmington. The 2016 tour schedule has just

season's details. High finishers at tour events earn an automatic bid to the tour championships scheduled for Saturday, July 16<sup>th</sup> [see photo on next page from the 2015 Tour Championships]. In addition to the region tour and national tours, such as the <u>USA Junior Beach Tour</u>, which by the way has 3 stops here in NC this year, there's a lot of opportunities for juniors to compete.

This Spring also marks the first collegiate championships for beach volleyball after the NCAA officially elevated sand volleyball as a women's collegiate championships sport for DI, DII, and DII this past year. The first NCAA championships for beach volleyball will be held May 6-8, 2016 in Gulf Shores, AL.
