# From the Top: Jim Ross

USA Volleyball believes that volleyball has so many positive things to offer those who participate. First, and most importantly, whether one is a gifted athlete or a recreational player, volleyball is FUN!



Men's Volleyball does not generally get much attention in our newsletters or in the US sporting news in general, and that is unfortunate. But today I want to share some

good news about the state of the men's game, as the epicenter of competition for men is quickly shifting East....or at least is no longer captive to the West Coast schools. Men's collegiate programs across the US have historically been heavily populated on the West Coast and Hawaii, with some consistent representation from Penn State, Ball State and IPFW in Indiana, Ohio State, and on occasion George Mason, Rutgers and Princeton. The usual suspects are still atop the men's rankings this season – Hawai'i, Pepperdine, Long Beach State and UCLA sit in the top four spots in the ACVA Coaches poll this

week. But over the last several years, strong programs have emerged from new and unusual places.... like recent national champion Loyola of Chicago, or Lewis University in Romeoville IL, and here in NC, even our own Mt. Olive men's programs. All have put together impressive and competitive programs on a national basis and continue to offer opportunities for men from our region to continue play at the collegiate level. Recently, small school Lincoln Memorial University (undergrad student pop. 1673, located in eastern Tennessee) swept powerhouse IPFW and #11 ranked Loyola of Chicago, and they have Hawai'i and Ohio State on their schedule later this season. The smaller schools are showing they can hang with the big boys. Mckendree University (total student pop. 2200 in Lebanon, IL) put on a very respectable competitive run

against Lincoln Memorial and Grand Canyon University (both recipients of top-25 votes for the Coaches poll this season) in January. And our own Mt. Olive University (Mt. Olive NC) men took #8 ranked BYU to five sets on Jan. 27 and lost in 4 sets on January 29. And Mt. Olive still has 12th ranked Ohio State coming up later this week. I've only touched on a number of schools that have not traditionally offered competitive men's programs. The point of all this is that men's volleyball is alive and well, and competitive programs are available to student athletes that aspire to play at the collegiate level across a variety of schools throughout the country. Women's indoor and beach programs generate the most tv and press coverage but the men's programs continue to grow and thrive as well. As we continue to work to make volleyball available to all comers regardless of age, gender, or socioeconomic status we still have significant work to do here in our state to foster offerings to men at the middle school and high school levels. But a small number of boys programs have registered for USAV indoor play this season, and the rapid growth and popularity of men's beach play is exposing folks to the game at earlier and earlier ages. We'll continue to watch the new and emerging programs compete with the traditional powerhouse schools as the sport continues to grow nationally. PLEASE NOTE: the Carolina Region offers a Boys Development Grant program to persons seeking to grow the boy's game in our state. Please reach out to the Region office if you have interest or ideas you want to share.

#### 2022 Beach News: USAV/AVP Partnership + Carolina Region Jr Beach Tour Mark Nalevanko, CR Junior Beach Director



In late fall 2021 an announcement was made regarding a <u>partnership between USAV and AVP</u> for beach volleyball. This will ultimately lead to a better strategic plan for the continued growth of the sport with involvement from both organizations. Initially for the upcoming 2022 season, the main changes that will be in place are:

A unified ranking system which will lead to results from events sanctioned by either USAV and/or AVP feeding into the same system and then subsequently being used for initial seeding of teams at events under either organization.

Hosts are permitted to dual-affiliate events meaning that a host can ask for memberships from both organizations as part of registration and offer bids to events at both organizations' national events this year.

In the longer run (2023 and beyond), the goals include a combined National Championship event(s) schedule along with a bidding process for such events and membership program.

Now with spring 2022 fast approaching, the <u>12th edition of the Carolina Region Jr Beach Tour</u> will continue to operate similarly to seasons past:

- All tour events have **results entered in the new unified ranking system** with participants earning points in the process with top finishers getting a bid to the tour championships (girls only).
- A new Mid-Atlantic Boys Beach Tour has been created and will be listed on the region tour page as well. Events on this tour will have a focus towards the boys but any host may offer boys divisions at other events as well, subject to their discretion.

**3 events on the tour** are classified as **Beach National Qualifiers (BNQ)**. Each BNQ will offer up to 4 bids per age division to the Open (top) division at the <u>National Beach</u> Tour Championships (location and dates TBD)

- o April 23-24 Greensboro
- o May 14-15 Carolina Grand Slam (Apex near Raleigh)
- o June 4-5 Charlotte

- o **Some additional events will be designated as Beach Regional Qualifiers (BRQ)** which will offer bids to the top 3 teams (3<sup>rd</sup> place is contested) in each age division to the American Division for the girls and the Open Division for the boys at the National Beach Tour Championships.
- o Additionally, some wildcard bids to Nationals may be offered. It is a topic still being finalized by USAV's Beach Committee.

**Regional championships** for the girls and a **Tour finals** for the boys will be held in mid-July subject to final dates and location announcement for the Beach Nationals.

We encourage all junior players from seasoned beach players to those just testing the sport out for the first time to get involved in the game by participating in any of the events held across the region. You may find yourself hooked before you know it!
